Ensure elected members of a Local Government Authority are covered by 'bullying' 'psychological injury' provisions as are expected within other 'industries.'	I have had recent experience of appalling, repeated aggressive behaviour by a CEO of an LGA toward me as an elected member to Council. There appears to be huge gaps in the OSH/WSH legislation in relation to elected members to Council. Provision needs to be made to include elected members into the legislation to protect Councillors from inappropriate and aggressive behaviour by employees of the LGA. Such behaviour is costly as it potentially thwarts the democratic process and corrupts due process resulting in bad decision making and diminishing the wellbeing of the community.
