## STATUTORY PUBLIC HOLIDAYS FOR 2009 AND NEW YEAR 2010

Under the provisions of the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972*, the following dates are public holidays during 2009 and over the New Year period 2010:

## NOTE:

Easter Tuesday and the extra day after New Year's Day are no longer public service holidays. Employees, who would have otherwise received the benefit of repealed public service holidays, are able to take two days' paid leave of absence in lieu of the repealed public service holidays. The two additional days paid at the rate of ordinary time, can be added to annual leave or taken individually but must be taken in the year in which they occur. Under no circumstances should these days be allowed to accrue. (Please refer to Premier's Circular 1 of 2003 issued by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet).
